COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMS

The Berwyn Heights Police Department is responsible for developing partnerships within the residents in an effort to create a safe and secure environment. This can be accomplished through community mobilization, crime prevention efforts and problem solving (i.e., Neighborhood Watch, Citizen Patrol, Specialized Program for the Residents etc.). Through mobilization, The Berwyn Heights Police Department can facilitate a community's efforts to create positive changes within their neighborhood.

PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMS FOR THE YOUTH

D.A.R.E. "DRUG ABUSE RESISTANCE EDUCATION"

The D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) program is designed to provide young people with skills

necessary to resist peer pressures which may lead to drug experimentation and use. D.A.R.E. represents a partnership between the BHPD Police Department and Berwyn Heights Elementary School and has been in existence since 2013. Furthermore, D.A.R.E. has achieved documented success as a national program. The program operates in every state and several foreign countries. Our BHPD D.A.R.E. officer is a veteran street patrol officer who has been trained to teach life skills to kindergarten through sixth grade children using group discussion, role playing, and open communication. D.A.R.E. is taught to focus on personal safety, building self-esteem, resisting peer pressure, decision-making skills, providing accurate information about drugs, consequences of drug use, and alternatives to drug use. CAREER DAY AT BHES

The Berwyn Heights Police officers, including the detective section and the Public Safety Aide Volunteers participate in the one-day program 'career day' at the Berwyn Heights Elementary School. Officers interact with the students and explain the complexity of being a police officer. "We catch criminals". "We collect evidence and at times we testify in court". The department investigator will discuss what is expected of individuals who wish to become a police officer or a non-sworn employee of the police department. This is an exciting career exploration event, designed by the BHPD officers, to support the Berwyn Heights Elementary students in determining their career pathways by giving them a sense of what a day in the life of a police officer

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT PROGRAM

National Night Out is a crime and drug prevention event that is sponsored nationally by the National Association of Town Watch and co-sponsored locally by the Berwyn Heights Police Department. It's a day when people hold events to strengthen community cohesiveness and crime resistance, and get to know their neighbors and their local public safety officials. When neighbors get to know each other, they create a connected and safer community. Every year, more than 300 people in Berwyn Heights participate in the event. National Night Out creates crime prevention awareness in the community through a multitude of local events, such as BBQ cookouts, dunk-tank, face painting for the kids, karate demonstration, and seminars. BHPD in partnership with the Berwyn Heights Neighborhood Watch, is very active in taking part in protecting children on their way to and from school. Our residents are determined to keep the neighborhoods safe. Police officers and the BHNW volunteers patrol the school and surrounding areas during the first day / week of the school. The first day / week patrol project involves no cost and the over-time for officers is formulated into the BHPD budget. This program demonstrates that when a community is asked to form partnerships for the safety of their own neighborhoods; they are willing to participate, this truly is community partnership. WELFARE CHECK NOTIFICATION FOR SENIORS / DISABLED PERSONS PROGRAM

The Berwyn Heights Police department provide extra checks on senior citizens and disabled residents as part of emergency welfare check notification program. The goal of the program is to provide the senior and disabled residents of Berwyn Heights with a sense of security. To be eligible, residents need to be age 50 or older or disabled at any age. A welfare checks on the aforementioned is conducted during exigent natural events and during holidays. Applications are available at the BHPD, and all information is confidential. SENIOR AND DISABLED PERSONS ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP POLICING PROGRAMS FOR THE RESIDENTS

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH OFFICERS PROGRAM

The Neighborhood Watch Officer program was created to provide a partnership between officers and Berwyn Heights Neighborhood Watch. As part of the BHPD's commitment to a community empowerment model of policing, the Department assigned two officers to attend the BHNW meeting once a Month. Officers often brief BHNW with the crime trends and willingness to look for creative solutions to prevent future crime within the community. Neighborhood Watch is a national program designed to educate residents about home safety and the importance of maintaining good communication with neighbors. BHPD and BHNW encourages the Berwyn Heights residents to become familiar with their neighbors' daily work hours and learn who "belongs" in the neighborhood and who doesn't. Members report suspicious activity to the BHPD. Members also help prevent crime by installing adequate locks on doors and windows and by making use of better lighting principles that discourage nefarious activities. Benefits of BHNW include the mobilization of informed citizens looking out for one another; the effective organization of watch groups who are able to address issues such as drug houses, street lighting, traffic and other neighborhood concerns; up-to-date information on crime trends; and police participation in BHNW activities. LATINO / HISPANIC OUTREACH PROGRAM

The Latino Outreach Programs was created to serve our community's growing Latino population. Officer Yomayra Ramirez and Police Administrative Clerk Iris Cruz currently serve as the Hispanic/Latino liaison outreach for the department. As the liaisons for the Department and for the Latino population in Town, which together provide support to the Spanish speaking population promoting cultural diversity and civic engagement. Additionally, they can provide referrals, interpretation and translation to Spanish speaking community members. Officer and Clerk helps, spread the word about events, new programs such as "Coffee with Cops", "National Night Out" or businesses, and job opportunities that could be of particular interest to the Spanish speaking and Latino community. In addition, they establish positive relations with the Hispanic/Latino community in order that persons will call the police when needed and help reduce crime and victimization and to assist with answering questions about Police matters and Town Services available to residents. TOWN WIDE NOTIFICATION PROGRAMS

NIXLE

The Town of Berwyn Heights residents have a way to be personally notified, either by text or email, when the BHPD Police Department becomes aware of a situation, the BHPD would like to share. Rather than finding out about it later, if at all, anyone can sign up to receive the texts or emails. The program has been in effect in Town for over ten years, but since it is only used for true emergencies or important notifications, the Police Department does not utilize the notification unless the aforementioned occurs. SOLICITATION IDENTIFICATIONS PERMIT PROGRAM

Residential solicitation is allowed in the Town of Berwyn Heights, but only if a Residential Solicitation Permit has been obtained and issued by the BHPD. Solicitors must obtain a Solicitation Permit from the Town Office Administrative Department. This permit requirement applies to individuals or organizations who are selling goods or services or who are seeking gifts or donations for an organization. A permit shall be valid for use by all members or employees of the organization. A valid government issued identification (e.g. driver's license) is required at the time of application. There is a \$15.00 application fee for the permit and all permits expire within one calendar year after the date of issuance. To protect and maintain the public health, safety, and general welfare, door to door solicitation and canvassing is strictly regulated by the Berwyn Heights Police Department. WANTED / RUNAWAY NOTIFICATION PROGRAM

The Wanted / Runaway Poster Program was prompted by a growing need to involve the residents in efforts to locate wanted fugitive and runaway of young persons. Colonel Kenneth K. Gattis-Antolik began the program in 1991 to help the residents, businesses and parents of runaway locate their children immediately after it was discovered they were missing. The program works by alerting members of the community about wanted fugitive / runaway children who might otherwise go unnoticed. The posters are placed on windows and local businesses. Runaway youth typically are found through reports by local residents or turn themselves in to avoid the unappreciated attention. The program is now handled by Detective Sergeant D. ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS FOR RIDE-ALONG PROGRAM:

1. Visiting dignitaries or officials.
2. Police officers from other jurisdictions.
3. College or university law enforcement students engaged in research.
5. Other members of the criminal justice system.
6. Individuals over the age of 16, and under the age of 18, who have been approved by the ranking patrol supervisor and/or Investigative Services Section with notarized documents on file.

PUBLIC SAFETY TRAINING / ANNOUNCEMENT PROGRAM

Through community service, education, and advocacy for public safety, the BHPD strive ways to improve the quality of life for the residents of Berwyn Heights for families, women, children, minorities, pets, LGBT, disables, veterans and the elderly. The Investigative Services Section and the Training & Education Section, of the BHPD is in the process of creating a short scripted public service announcement for the local Berwyn Heights Cable Television station. The goal for BHPD PSAs is to create awareness, show the importance of a problem or issues within the community and convey information. BHPD PSAs will create a forum for the residents to actively participate in a project that allows them to become stewards for behavior and social changes. THE VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS

Because of legal requirements related to police facility security, we require all volunteers to be fingerprinted and complete a background check prior to being accepted into the program.

POLICE SAFETY AIDE PROGRAM

The PSA program is designed for youth ages 15 to 21 who have an interest in law enforcement as a career. Each PSA is required to put in a minimum of 10 hours monthly. They must attend one meeting monthly and work within the department doing duties such as Traffic Control, Berwyn Heights Day, National Night Out, Halloween Patrol and any special events. They also work at various assignments throughout the department as needed. Once accepted into the program, PSA are required to submit to a rigorous background investigation and have at least a 3.2 GPA. This program allows for 05 active participants. SENIOR CITIZENS POLICE LIAISON VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

The Senior Police Liaison Volunteer Program is designed for those individuals who are 50 years of age and older. They must contribute a minimum of 10 hours each month and are encouraged to attend the BHPD departmental meeting(s) including Seniors Club meeting twice a month. Seniors work in such areas as senior house check, information booths, front desk, Special Investigation with the Investigative Services Unit, Police Administration, Crime Analysis, and traffic control. INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The BHPD Police Department Internship Program exists as a cooperative partnership between the department and various universities including University of Maryland, Prince George's Community College, and any accredited on-line University. The BHPD Police Department Internship Program has been in existence for approximately six years. Intern duties and responsibilities vary from student to student but may include work that is clerical, or pertains to a specific area for accreditation. In addition, some internships involve working on a research or evaluation project that provides educational benefits to the student in addition to direct community benefits to Berwyn Heights residents. Students are required to work between 10 and 20 hours each week to satisfy internship requirements. Ultimately the goal of this program is to afford students the opportunity to gain valuable experience for careers in various law enforcement and social service.
