Black-Eyed
Susan

Maryland State Flower is a bright yellow perennial that blooms from June to October. The Black-Eyed Susan thrives in full sun or partial sun and plant grows up to four feet tall and is deer resistant and attracts native bees, hover flies and butterflies.



Garden Phlox
and
Moss Phlox

Garden phlox is a red-pink perennial that grows two to three feet tall with blooms much of the summer.

Moss phlox is a ground cover that has red-pink blooms in early spring.

Both attract native bees, hover flies, butterflies, and hummingbirds and are deer resistant and need full sun.



Aster

The New England Aster is a purple perennial that blooms from August to October. The Aster needs full or partial sun and grows up to five feet tall. It attracts native bees, hover flies and butterflies. However, it is not deer resistant.



Milkweed

Common Milkweed is a red-pink perennial that blooms in June through August and needs full sun. It grows up to six feet tall. It is tolerant to mowing and is deer resistant and attracts native bees, hover flies, and butterflies.



Sunflower

The Oxeye Sunflower is a bright yellow perennial that grows around three feet tall that blooms throughout the summer. It attracts native bees, hover flies, and butterflies. However, deer sometime enjoy the Oxeye sunflower as a snack.

The Purple Coneflower grows 2-3 feet tall with purple blooms from April through September. It needs full or partial sun. It attracts native bees, hover flies, butterflies and is deer resistant.
