NEW TOWN COUNCIL LEADERSHIP



After four years serving Berwyn Heights on the Town interview with the Council, Mayor Chris Rasmussen formally resigned letter of interest marked on July 16, 2018. He has accepted an invitation to join the Colorado Department of Higher Education as Director of Academic Affairs and is relocating to Denver. Per the Town Charter Mayor Pro Tem Lynn White automatically assumed the role of Mayor. Councilmember Stephen Isler was appointed and sworn in as Mayor Pro Tem.

The Council voted to use the application process described in the Town Charter to fill the current vacancy on the Town

Council. Qualified residents are encouraged to apply. You must be at least 21 years old, a registered voter of Prince George's County, and resident of Berwyn Heights for at least 6 months.
