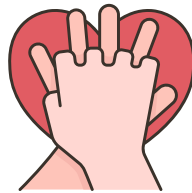
## Emergency Skills Classes

Neighborhood Watch/Emergency Preparedness is sponsoring two very important classes to help equip the community with skills that can save a life.

During the regularly scheduled meeting on February 7th, the Prince George's County Health Department will be holding a training program for residents on the use of Naloxone (a drug that reverses opioid overdose symptoms) and educating residents on Fentanyl, Xylazine, and all related opioids.

**Register by February 1st to receive a Narcan kit on completion of the training.**

CPR/AED and First Aid training will take place on Saturday, February 24th from 1-4PM in the Town Center (2nd Floor). This life-saving class will cover topics such as Cardio-Plumonary Resuscitation (CPR), use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), choking response, and bleeding and wound care. **Advance registration is required and all who register by February 22nd will be awarded CPR certification upon completion of the class.**

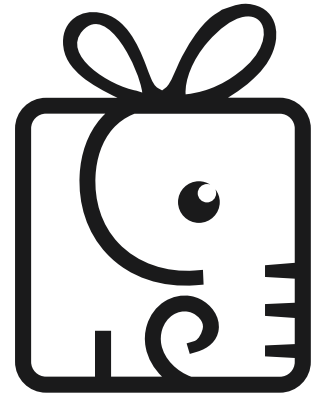

Prince George's County's Better Bag Bill went into effect on January 1st, 2024. This legislation prohibits the use of single use plastic bags and requires a charge for paper or reusable bags at the point of sale for many of the places you shop.
