
A Little More Electric

Did you know that the Town has four publicly available EV chargers? Since 2019, two EV chargers have been available at Town Hall, in the back parking lot. Recently, in cooperation with Pepco, two new chargers have been installed near the Police Department, across the street from Lake Artemesia. Visitors to the lake are welcome to take advantage of these chargers!

A Committment to Sustainability

The Town of Berwyn Heights has a long history of committment to sustainability. The first fully electric vehicle was brought into the Police Department in September of 2021. The Ford Mustang Mach E of the first fully electric vehicles to be a part of a police fleet in the State. Berwyn Heights is proud to lead as other police departments in the State now explore EV options. Code Compliance began the Town's EV fleet with a 2019 Ford Fusion, a plug-in hybrid vehicle.

Two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation, on June 19, 1865 Union troops lead by Major General Gordon Granger reached Galveston, Texas to share the news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free. General Granger read General Order Number 3 which began "The people of Texas are informed that in accordance with a Proclamation from the Executive of the Unites States, all

slaves are free. This involves an absolute equity of rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves, and the connection heretofore existing between them becomes that between employer and hired laborer." The celebration of June 19th was coined Juneteenth and grew from participation of the descendants of former slaves. Having been celebrated for over 155 years, Juneteenth is considered the longest celebrated African American holiday. It was first recognized as a federal holiday in 2021 when President Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence DayAct.
