This is a rough scope for a possible permanent structure to be built behind the sr center. As you know the rec council is looking into renting a large open tent structure to be used for Berwyn Heights Day and if it works out the same idea could be used for other outdoor events. This is just a rough scope of what we might need because we need to see how the rental structure does. My points for a permanent structure are as follows:

- 1) The structure size will need to be determined by how well the rental structure performs during Berwyn Heights Day. The tent size we should be getting is 25' x 60'. The permanent structure can be sized after we use the rental.
- 2) Are there any code issues with putting a permanent structure there? The structure can be made high enough for car and small trucks to pass under so there will still be some access behind the main building when the pavilion is not in use.
- 3) Power should be available in the pavilion for lighting and other uses such as sound systems and outside cooking equipment.
- 4) Provisions for accessing the town office network for outside meetings when needed and wifi during events.
- 5) The construction materials are not important as long as the structure is sound and has a guarantee. Another factor to consider is the ability to customize the structure like temporary side walls for cold weather use.
